## DIRECTOR'S Statement

I am delighted to be presenting The Halifax Helpers's annual report as our first year in operation draws to a close.

Since our initial launch in the Spring of 2020, we've shifted our mandate from a temporary support service, to a permanent youth-run organization. We have spent the last year providing Nova Scotian students with the academic support they require to become fearless, lifelong learners. In 2020-2021 our wonderful group of 80 volunteer tutors have worked with 100+ families to offer an average of 120 tutoring sessions every week.

This year, our outstanding executive board was established. Members were selected to lead development in fundraising and finance, volunteer recruitment, and social media outreach. Their efforts have resulted in the onboarding of 80 volunteers, over \$10,000 in funding, and a reach of 29,900 people on our social media platforms.

To support the efforts of our board, it became evident that several processes within our network needed to be made more efficient; we started with our website. With the help of 3 O'Clock Design, we have streamlined our booking process and created an intuitive and accessible website for users. This system redesign was sponsored by generous community donations and our friends at The YMCA of Greater Halifax/Dartmouth.

This year has also presented copious opportunities for our team to learn the ins and outs of the nonprofit world.


