Letter from our Founder

As our third year in operation comes to a close, I am once again beaming with pride and am excited to share what our team at The Halifax Helpers has accomplished throughout the 2021/22 school year.

Since the publishing of our last impact report we have prioritized creating strong partnerships with organizations in our community. We connected with both SchoolsPlus and The Halifax Center for Regional Education who helped us expand our programming and our reach. By working together we have almost tripled the number of students we were able to support, offering tutoring sessions to over 315 families in Nova Scotia and beyond. In addition, we want to extend our most profound thank you to the 83 volunteer tutors on our team who gave their time to make these sessions possible.

These partnerships not only expanded our reach, but allowed us to better understand the needs of our community. By connecting with frontline educators at SchoolsPlus we were able to develop three new programs which support parents, in regard to their child's academic needs, and students, in relation to their own.

Although we are proud of our rapid growth our team has learnt just how quickly resources can become strained when an organization expands. I am impressed with the way we have adapted and problem solved - this has made us stronger. One of our greatest takeaways, however, is that it is ok to have growing pains. We will use the feedback we have received from our team members, parents, and students to make sure we enter into the 2022/23 school year more prepared than ever.

A sincere thank you to all of our donors who believed in THH's mission and the ability of youth to, as my dad would say, "make it happen". Through the 2022/23 school year we are excited to continue to deepen our existing partnerships while simultaneously creating new connections, expanding our reach, and learning how to best support our community.



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New Developments

This year the Halifax Helpers have launched three new pilot programs:



Laptop Lending

In collaboration with SchoolsPlus, 64 Chromebook laptops and 15 Mifi wifi sticks were distributed to students in need. This expanded accessibility not only to our services, but to online learning as a whole.



EAL conversation groups

A pilot, in-person, weekly conversation group of 8 EAL students was launched at St. Agnes Junior High modelled from our popular online conversation group.



Caregiver tutoring

This program was designed in collaboration with the Halifax Regional Centre for Education to teach caregivers with schoolaged children strategies for supporting their child with at home math learning. Five sessions were run by a math coach and 20 caregivers attended.


